LEAD GROUNDSKEEPER

Definition

Under general direction, to serve as a lead groundskeeper and participate in the performance of grounds maintenance and gardening work around work sites, schools and District offices; and to do related work as required.

Responsible to

Supervisor of Maintenance, Operations and Transportation

Examples of Duties

- 1. Leads and participates in grounds maintenance and gardening work, and possesses all qualifications common to that class.
- 2. Schedules and determines priorities of work and affects liaison with site administrators and the Maintenance, Operations and Transportation Department.
- 3. Lays out and assigns work to groundskeeper personnel and supervises for proper completion.
- 4. Instructs personnel in the proper methods, materials and equipment used in grounds care.
- 5. Assists in the supervision and training of assigned personnel.
- 6. Keeps records and reports on activities.
- 7. Applies pesticides and herbicides.
- 8. Keeps records of supplies and equipment.
- 9. Orders materials and supplies.
- 10. Layout, install and maintain sprinkler systems.
- 11. Identifies animal and insect problems and takes appropriate corrective action.
- 12. Arranges for new planting, transplanting and removal or reconditioning of shrubs, lawns and trees.

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- 13. Ensures the proper care, cleaning, repair and replacement of equipment.
- 14. Assists in the maintenance and replacement of asphalt, concrete and fencing.
- 15. Requisitions materials and equipment to maintain stock levels.
- 16. Performs other duties as may be assigned.

Qualifications Guide

Knowledge of:

- 1. Landscape gardening work, including knowledge of methods, supplies and tools used in planting, cultivating and caring for lawns, trees and shrubs.
- 2. Pest and weed control chemicals, materials and techniques.
- 3. Principles of supervision and training.
- 4. Sprinkler installation and repair.
- 5. General safety procedures and practices.
- 6. Diseases affecting trees, lawns and shrubs.

Ability to

- 1. Coordinate the District gardening and grounds keeping work.
- 2. Proficiently use various gardening and grounds maintenance tools and power equipment safely.
- 3. Perform heavy manual labor.
- 4. Drive and operate trucks and large power equipment efficiently and safely.
- 5. Supervise work performance of the employees.
- 6. Maintain accurate and complete reports.
- 7. Understand, carry out and give oral and written instructions.

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- 8. Maintain cooperative-working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- 9. Diagnose common plant diseases and insect pests and approved methods and materials used in their control.

Training and Experience

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade; four years of progressively responsible experience in grounds maintenance or gardening work, including experience in a supervisory capacity; or any combination of training and experience that could likely provide the desired knowledge and abilities.

License

- 1. Possession of a valid California Driver's License.
- 2. Possession of a certificate for the application of restricted use pesticides.

Good physical condition.
