






FUESD SCHOOLS LEARNING MODEL OPTIONS

OPTION 1



100% FACE-TO-FACE LEARNING

(ON CAMPUS 5 DAYS A WEEK)

• All students return everyday

• Lower class sizes

Stable groupings

Maximized space between students

• No large group gatherings

Face coverings

Modified schedules

Additional teachers to lower class size

OPTION 2



100% ONLINE LEARNING

(AT HOME 5 DAYS A WEEK)

Attendance taken daily

- Daily instruction and independent work
 - 5 days a week online
- Tech support for students and parents
- Extra support for students most in need
- Professional development for teachers to help support online instruction

FEATURES OF AN ON-CAMPUS SCHOOL DAY (OPTION 1)

IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION

Face-to-face instruction in the classroom five days a week with maximized space between students.

Slightly shortened schedule to allow for staggered start and ending times, breaks and avoiding large groupings.

CLASS SIZE AVERAGES

- TK-3rd Grade | 24:1
- 4-6th Grade | 26:1
- 7-8th Grade | 28:1

Site-specific entry and exit points to avoid potential over crowding.



MODIFIED SCHEDULE

DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROTOCOLS

CONNECTEDNESS

Opportunities for students to engage with one another and further develop social skills.

PROTECTIVE MEASURES

Physical distancing, advanced sanitation, daily health screenings and face coverings.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

- Prioritize Social Emotional Learning to provide support for all students as they return to Online Learning
 - Build a safe and inclusive virtual classroom community

TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT

• Ensure that all students have access to technology infrastructure and devices that support learning at home

• Family support on use of technology to support student learning and engagement



STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

• Structured schedule to support access, engagement, and academic achievement

 Increased school to home communication re: student expectations for online learning and work completion

OPTION 2 ONLINE LEARNING CHOICES





100% Online Program TAUGHT BY FUESD TEACHERS

- Daily instruction and independent work required
 - 5 days a week online
 - Schedule created by FUESD teachers
 - Tech support for students and parents
 - Extra support for students most in need



100% Homeschooling TAUGHT BY PARENTS

- Option for new and continuing homeschool students
 - 5 days a week at home
 - Flexible schedule based on family needs
 - Weekly check-ins with FUESD teacher
 - Must meet requirements to participate

OUR PLAN TO REOPEN WILL BE BASED ON DATA AND GUIDANCE FROM PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICIALS. IF CONDITIONS CHANGE, SO WILL OUR REOPENING PLAN.



BLENDED LEARNING MODEL (IF REQUIRED)

50/50% EDUCATION

- Two days a week in the classroom
 - Three days a week at home
- M/W or T/Th cohorts to lower class size

If public health data and guidelines do not allow for 100% face-to-face on campus learning, all FUESD schools will move to a blended learning model.

LEARNING SUPPORT

- Additional online learning support
- Teacher support for student in needed
- Online instruction for home learning days

OPTIONS FOR LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

NO MATTER WHAT THE REOPENING PLAN, WE WILL IMPLEMENT SAFETY PROTOCOLS TO THE HIGHEST DEGREE POSSIBLE FOR STUDENTS AND STAFF.







COUNSELING AND SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

• Provide individual and group counseling to students

• Train staff on trauma informed practices, mental health and well-being

• Full-time counselors in place at every school

SAFETY AND PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

• Utilize PPE (face coverings and/or shields for staff., etc.)

• Double daytime sanitation and custodial support for all schools

 Additional hand-washing and handsanitizing stations

WELLNESS

ADJUSTED INSTRUCTION TO SUPPORT HEALTH

• Lower class sizes to promote spacing and other safety measures

• Limit activities with large groups and high social contact

• Provide education around minimizing spread of infectious disease


HEALTH AND WELLNESS SCREENING

• Temperature checks daily for all students and staff

• Procedure for isolating students with a fever or other symptoms

• Full-time nurses in place at every school

ACCESS AND CONNECTIVITY

• Our goal is for all FUESD students to access to the internet

 Mobile hotspots for students without internet access at home

TECHNOLOGY TO SUPPORT ALL LEARNING MODELS

• Personal devices for Tk-8th grade students to support learning at home and in the classroom

• Digital communication and collaboration tools developed to support face-to-face and online learning

DISINFECTION AND SANITATION

• Regularly disinfect shared classroom items such as tables and chairs.

• Disinfect high-touch surfaces throughout day

FOOD SERVICES | STAFF

- Staff must wear appropriate PPE
- Create markers to indicate physical distance between students
 - Use disposable and/or sanitized reusable tableware
 - Keypad screens sanitized between every use

FACILITIES

PRACTICING PHYSICAL DISTANCING

• Maximize space between student desks to the greatest extent possible

• Providing plexiglass barriers for staff with frequent contact with the public

FOOD SERVICES | STUDENTS


• Students use facecoverings

- Students must sanitize hands upon entry and exit
- Students must sit at distanced desks/ tables per Public Health guidelines

• Plastic/laminated meal cards used and sanitized daily



OPERATIONS



ESSENTIAL VISITORS

• No visitors or volunteers (including parents) on campus

DISTRICT OFFICE

- Manage reserves for PPE, thermometers, surface and hand disinfectants, etc.
- Frequently re-evaluate for infectious disease management
- Establish district protocol for notifying exposure of confirmed cases


• Practicing physical distancing at school loading zones
