


# ONLINE LEARNING FOR FUESD SCHOOLS

Teacher-led online learning for the entire school year



### COMMON EXPECTATIONS

- Daily attendance is required
- Daily live interaction for all students with their teacher(s)
- Synchronous and asynchronous instruction to teach grade level standards
- Work completion, progress monitoring/ assessment, grades assigned
- All students will have access to a district provided chromebook
- Hotspots will be provided for students who do not have internet access
- Tech support for parents, students and staff



### TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT UPDATE

- Ended the school year with 97% of our families had internet connectivity
- Chromebooks were 1:1 for grades 3-8 and offered to tk-2 families who need a device (this upcoming year we will be 1:1 for grade tk-8)
- It will work closely with the sites to ensure that all students have access to a device and a hotspots
- Partnering with Verizon to provide district filtered hotspots free of charge to students who need them
- · Continuing to work with att to provide a solution for Deluz area
- District upgrades to support ever-increasing bandwidth needs, growing from 1 gig speeds to 10 gig speeds

- Any FUESD student can visit their school site to pick up meals.
- Mondays & Wednesdays between 6:30 am-8:30 am
- Curbside pick up, stay in your car, students do not need to be present

Who?

Any FUESD student can visit their school site to pick up meals.

Students approved for Free or Reduced-price meals will get meals at no cost.

Students not approved for Free or Reduced-price meals will be charged for the meals served. {Monday = \$9, Wednesday = \$13.50}

What?

Child Nutrition Services is proud to provide breakfast and lunch for students while they are learning from home.

Entrees are served frozen to reheat at home. Fresh fruits, vegetables, 100% juice, and milk will be provided. All foods must be kept cold.

Where? Visit your school site to pick up meals at the times listed below.

When?

Mondays & Wednesdays between 6:30 am—8:30 am

Monday provides: breakfast & lunch for Monday & Tuesday.

Wednesday provides: breakfast & lunch for Wednesday—Friday.

Remember to keep your meals refrigerated after pick up!

How?

Curbside pick up, stay in your car, students do not need to be present.

- ⇒ Please wear a face covering.
  - ⇒ Tell the server your child's student ID number (5 digits).
  - ⇒ Pull forward to pick up meals from cart through drivers' side window. There

# STAFF SAFETY PRIORITIES AND PROTOCOLS

# WELCOMEBACKI

District Leadership and Classified Staff have worked through the pandemic to mitigate the risks related to COVID-19.

We are proud of the District's significant efforts and investment as we welcome back staff at our schools and students online.

# STAFF SAFETY

Our number one priority remains the safety and well-being of our students and staff.

Providing face coverings for all staff

Providing proper PPE for nurses, custodians, and child nutrition staff

Symptom screening and temperature checks using no-touch thermometers

# OFFICESAFETY

We have worked hard to provide the safest office environment possible for our team.

Plexiglass shields installed in offices and high traffic areas

Reconfiguring offices, staff lounges, and PD areas for social distancing

# SCHOOL-SITE SAFETY

We have worked hard to provide the safest school sites for our team.

Provide portable hand washing stations at schools

Provide hand sanitizer stands at schools and high traffic areas

Provide hand sanitizer in all classrooms

(not just rooms without sinks)

### VENTILATION AND FILTRATION

Ventilation and filtration provided by HVAC systems may help mitigate COVID-19 transmission.

- Reprogram HVAC systems to bring in fresh outdoor air
- HVAC fans will operate throughout the day
- Upgrade HVAC filters to antimicrobial treated filters
- Increase number of times HVAC filters are changed
- Increase ventilation by opening doors and windows

# PHYSICAL DISTANCING AND SITE PRECAUTIONS

Physical distancing requires staff to stay 6 feet from one another and from students.

- Signage encouraging social distancing, facial coverings, symptom screening
- · Social distancing markers placed in waiting areas
- Double student desks are being replaced with single desks
- · Additional storage containers at schools for non-essential furniture
- Suspended community use of facilities
- Limiting use of playground equipment
- Disabled drinking fountains
