ELO Program Goals 23-24

1. Provide an enriching academic learning environment through Arts and STEM to close the achievement gap. (QS 1, 3, 6) (Intervention includes homework assistance, skills studies, and ELD support)

2. Promote student well-being through opportunities to learn about and practice balanced nutrition, physical activity, restorative practices, and other healthy choices for mind and body. (QS 1, 2, 3, 5)




